*** (FCPAC) SCHEDULE:****Fri, June 28 – Dusk-to-Dark**

- **5–7 pm:** Registration and check in at the Presque Isle Park Pavilion. Bring painting surfaces to be stamped. (You may register/check in for Saturday also at this time.)
- **7–10 pm:** Paint at any location within Presque Isle Park.
- **10 pm:** Paintings must be turned in at the Pavilion
- **10–11 pm:** Artists may enjoy wine and light refreshments, while previewing the evening's paintings.

Saturday, June 29 - All-Day Paint Session & Reception

- **7:00–9:00 am:** Register, check in, & have your painting surfaces stamped (if you did not do so Friday evening).
- **7 am–4:30 pm:** Time to paint!
- **3–4:30 pm:** Completed paintings returned to the Pavilion.
- **4:30–5 pm:** Judging. Only Fresh Coast Plein Air officials will be allowed inside the building during this time. When judging is completed, artists may enter to put out cards & price their work.
- **6–8:30 pm:** Reception
- **7 pm:** Awards Presentation
- **7:45 pm:** Peoples' Choice voting closes
- **8 pm:** Peoples' Choice Award presented

*** FCPAC ENTRY FEES:**

- **Fri, Dusk-to-Dark (for both levels):** pre-registered - \$10; day-of registration - \$15
- **Sat, All Day:** Self-place when registering for Level 1 or for Level 2 (described above). The entry fee and competition are higher in Level 1, but the cash prizes are also higher.)
- **Level 1:** pre-registered - \$25; day-of registration - \$30
- **Level 2:** pre-registered - \$15; day-of registration - \$20

*** FCPAC RULES:**

- All artists are required to read, understand, & comply with all rules. No exceptions will be made. Entries will be rejected if all rules are not observed.
- Artists are required to check in at the registration desk at the Presque Isle Park Pavilion, 2 Peter White Drive in Presque Isle Park and have their painting surfaces stamped. If you are painting both days, you may have all your painting surfaces stamped on Fri & need not check in again on Sat. If you are painting only on Sat, you may check in either day.
- **Fri, "Dusk to Dark", artists** may paint anywhere within the boundaries of Presque Isle Park. Emphasis should be on capturing the late day light, sunset, etc.
- **Sat artists** may paint at any Marquette city or shoreline location. (See map for designated painting area.)
- **Artists** may begin working immediately after check-in. Work must be returned to the show/reception location at the Pavilion at Presque Isle Park according to the Schedule of Events above.
- **Artists' Reception on Sat:** Paintings must remain on display until the end of the reception & must be removed at the close of the reception. Artists are strongly

- encouraged to remain for the duration of the reception to meet and discuss their work with the public. If an artist is not able to remove work at the end of the reception, he/she is responsible for making arrangements with someone for their removal. The FCPA Committee, MACC, & City of Marquette will not be responsible for damage to/or loss of paintings left at the end of the reception.
- Organizing committee members are permitted to compete and will be eligible for prizes.
- Juror of Awards to be announced

FCPAC Entry Requirements

- Must be 2-dimensional;
- May be in any wet or dry medium except photography;
- Must be completed en plein air;
- Must illustrate or be representative of the scene; abstract realism is acceptable but non-representational work will be rejected;
- Must be signed **on the back only for judging**. Artist may sign on the front **after** judging, if desired. Work submitted for judging with front signature will be rejected.

Number of Entries for FCPAC

- **One piece** may be submitted for Dusk-to-Dark (There will be an award for the Dusk-to-Dark winner & this painting will also be eligible for an award in the overall competition.)
- **Two pieces** may be submitted for the Sat session.
- **Only surfaces stamped at check-in will be accepted for judging.**
- Artists may frame pieces for judging if desired, but this is not required. Frames may be wired for hanging or displayed on table easels. Some tables.
- Sales may be made at any time during the festival. Prospective buyers should make arrangements with the artist & a Festival committee member.
- Artists must agree to allow discounts to Festival sponsors purchasing paintings during the Festival. The discount schedule is:
ARTS BENEFACTOR – 15%
ARTS SUPPORTER- 10%
- Artists may place business cards & prices on their paintings **after** the completion of judging.

Sales for FCPAC

- Easels will be available for artists' use and wire mesh display panels will be available for hanging.
- No commission will be collected, but a voluntary donation by the artist of 10-15% (after discount, if applicable) would be gratefully accepted, to be used toward next year's expenses. See a Fresh Coast official for details.
- The Awards juror will judge entries for cash prizes, totaling at least \$2,500, for Dusk-to-Dark, Saturday's competition, & a Peoples' Choice Award.

The selected design will be reproduced as a full-color, limited edition poster for the 2019 Blueberry Festival. The winning entry will be determined by a combined score based on an online vote open to the public & a panel of judges comprised of local artists, downtown business owners and public officials.

Specifications

- **Only original artwork** submitted by artist or artist’s representative will be accepted. All images used in the artwork must be original.
- Submit actual artwork; no slides accepted.
- Original artwork must be clearly labeled on the back of the piece with the artist name, phone number, & title of the work.
- Artwork must be submitted matted, framed or otherwise mounted & gallery-ready for display.
- **Only two** entries allowed per artist – but a separate entry form is required for each piece submitted.
- **Two-dimensional** artwork only.
- All media is eligible.
- Size must not exceed 11” x 17”
- Artwork must not have been previously reproduced.
- **No lettering or text on the artwork will be allowed except for an artist’s signature, which should be no larger than 1” x 3”.** Artwork submitted with lettering or text will not be accepted. **Questions:** call DDA office at (906) 228-9475
- If artwork selected, artist required to sign posters and attend the Blueberry Festival on **Friday, July 26, 2019**
- **Entry deadline: Tues, May 14**

Online submissions received without original artwork will not be considered.
