### **WANTED!: Art Instructors!**

The MACC & the Senior Center are looking for local artists to teach monthly Senior Visual Art classes for community members ages 55+ at the MACC. Classes take place on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays of each month, & can encompass any medium: E.g., painting, metalsmithing, eco-printing, drawing, etc. Teachers are asked to teach both classes in the month, offering the same class on two separate dates to better accommodate the seniors' schedules & ensure there's enough room for all who are interested.

Class capacity is set by the teacher but is typically between 10-16 students per class.

Instructors are compensated \$100 per class session (\$200 for the month).
